## Our Elevation Staff

We like to emphasize the fact that our Elevation community is really led by a large number of gifted people who generously give of their time and abilities to serve the church and the broader community. But we also hear questions about who is actually on "Staff" around here, so the following is a bit of an introduction to those who are privileged to be able to serve vocationally:



Helen Kroeker is affectionately referred to as our 'office guru' where she is the primary contact person in our office and a source of practical assistance and encouragement for people in our community. She also prepares the program each week, but isn't keen on having minor typos pointed out...just so you know.

Brandon Malo provides spiritual leadership and visionary direction for the church. He is the primary teacher on Sunday mornings and also connects pastorally with members of our congregation, guides the Staff, and chairs the Steering Committee. And since he wrote these staff bios, he doesn't get a witty comment.



Every Sunday, Eric Dettweiler leads our community in worship through music. He provides leadership in both planning Sunday services and coordinating the efforts of a number of ministry teams involved from week to week. He can also juggle and ride a unicycle, but that has nothing to do with his job here.

Steve Tulloch serves as the Community Care Pastor, providing coaching to ministry leaders, helping us engage with the broader KW community, and caring pastorally for members of our own congregation. Steve has a tendency to find himself in very unusual situations, so be careful around him.



Sharon Leage's passion for helping our youngest members grow in faith is expressed in her leadership of our Kids' Quest program, where she works with parents and teachers to create an inspiring environment on Sunday mornings. She is also British, so if you like accents, just ask her a question.

Graham Watson is the most recent addition to our Staff Team and we are excited to have him on board providing direction to our growing Youth group. In his interview, he told us that he had recently lit a couch on fire. What does that say about him? And since we hired him, what does that say about us?



Brandon and Emma Richardson provide leadership to our on-campus Student and Young Adult community called The Embassy. They spend their time connecting with students, investing in a vibrant team of young leaders, and preparing for Monday night services. Ever since they got married, they've had the same last name.

## MISSION TEAM

2015 began with our 2 mission teams, LIFE (local) and GMC (global) functioning separately. In the fall of 2015 they amalgamated and now work as the MISSION team.

In 2015 we continued to support our many partners serving around the world. **Craig and Leilani Bauman** finished their training with New Tribes Mission and began looking at visa options for their family to be able to live in Mongolia. They continue to seek direction in making this possible. **Gord and Sharon Skopnik** joined a new organization AVANT, and continue to work with local refugees in our area and with the people of South Sudan. **Nikki Horne** completed her program in Toronto and made several trips to and from Ecuador working with the Onzole community.

The **Bolivian Children Foundation** stays committed to bringing awareness and building support here in Canada for the work of Ninos Con Valor with children in Bolivia. Once again the significant response to the stockings at Christmas time was greatly appreciated. **Terry and Brenda Martin** advocate for First Nations people through the work of Rising Above in Manitoba. **Melissa Mellick** with Intervarsity and **Trevor and Becky Gingerich** at Embassy Humber, journey with students through the significant season of University life. **Karl Gingerich** at International Teams works at providing tech support to people living mission all over the world, as well as keeping the Elevation staff on track!

Up until the end of 2015, when our local and international mission efforts united under our one MISSION team, Elevation's local mission initiatives were coordinated by the LIFE team. Our primary areas of focus were on refugees, under the growing leadership of our Journey team, community gardens, the Sunnysdale Community, and SHOW. Our involvement in the Multi-Cultural Community Gardens is led by Fanis Juma-Radstake and reflects our commitment to share food with others, connect more deeply with the land, and build community with New

Canadians in particular. Emerging from the MC Community Gardens has been the Young City Growers, a youth employment initiative which then sells CSA baskets to people in the community.

Sunnydale is an economically challenged community in North Waterloo that is home to many New Canadians, single moms, and students. Elevation's Jeremy and Mary Horne live on the edge of this community and lead our church into engagement in various children, youth and family initiatives like Running and Reading, Sunnydale Connects, Gym nights, and many others. SHOW stands for Supportive Housing of Waterloo, and has become a home for a number of people from this region for whom housing security had long been an issue. Helen and Ron Kroeker lead a team of several Elevation people who enjoy sharing meals monthly and developing meaningful friendships with the folks who call SHOW home.

### **Journey Re-Cap 2015**

The Phylus (a Rohingya family from Myanmar) arrived in August and after 6 months are adjusting well. They're completing English school and looking towards further schooling in Canada as well as for employment opportunities.

One potential sponsorship of a family from the Democratic Republic of the Congo wasn't completed because the family was government-sponsored to the US (Ohio). The team in KW are continuing to support both the local family members and those in Ohio. Our church wrote holiday cards to local MPs, urging them to support Family Reunification, especially that of Pastor Lal and his family in Bangladesh.

We have two new sponsorship groups formed that will have refugee families arriving in Canada in 2016. Also in the plan for 2016: a one day crash course in journeying with refugees, compiling a Sponsorship Resource Guide, and a Journey page on Elevation's website: [elevationwaterloo.org/journey](http://elevationwaterloo.org/journey)

Thank you very much to everyone who participated in our ADVENTure. The cookies, cards, prayers and stockings were all much appreciated. We look forward to learning about and living out MISSION together in the coming 2016.

A new initiative that they will be taking on is leading the children in worship once a month on Sunday mornings. We are also very glad to have members of the youth worship team in the regular worship team schedule.

We believe that worship through music and singing together is an important part of our faith journey here. We look forward to all that God has in store for the worship ministry this coming year.

## **Facilities at 22 Willow**

The Joint Property Committee is a group that features three members each from Elevation and St. John's. This team is responsible for overseeing all aspects of the building and property and making recommendations to each congregation's senior leadership team. Steve Errey, Dale Horst & Sam Bauman are the Elevation delegates on this team.



Over the course of the past year the renovation of the Adult Education Room has been completed. Renamed the "Upper Room", this space has a small kitchenette and is ideal for smaller group meetings. Other improvements to our facilities was the installation of some new AC units and improved storage for chairs under the gym stage. The youth have completely renovated their space in the basement and it is looking great!

We are continually looking for ways to reduce the costs of maintenance. Volunteers for maintenance and construction projects are much appreciated and help to reduce costs. Thank-you!

We are renting out 24 of our parking spaces during business hours to people that work up-town for an income of \$65/month per space. Some of the projects we hope to advance this year are a new 22 Willow sign out front, repairs to the limestone around the entrances, and improved accessibility to our facility. Other responsibilities of the Joint Property Committee include overseeing security, coordinating regular maintenance for this beautiful old building, and making arrangements for care of the outdoor property as a whole.

### **Prayer Shawl Ministry**

The 22 Willow prayer shawl ministry ([www.shawlministry.com](http://www.shawlministry.com)) began in September 2014 as a joint ministry of St. John's and Elevation. Each shawl is prayerfully knit or crocheted, and then blessed by a pastor before being presented to a recipient in need of comfort or who is celebrating a joyous occasion. These handmade shawls show people they are not alone but are embraced by our community and God's love.

During 2015, the St. John's/Elevation prayer shawl group consisted of 12 members who prepared 24 shawls for distribution in 2015.

Prayer shawls are often given to people in the two church communities needing comfort, negotiating difficult life transitions, experiencing positive life transitions or celebrating life transitions or celebrating joyous occasions. Church members may notify church staff or the ministry representative of a person who should receive a shawl.

All knitters, loom knitters and crocheters of any level of ability are welcome to join the prayer shawl group. Crafts may use their own yarn or donated yarn. We also gladly accept donations of wool.

We meet in the parlor on the second Monday of the month from 1-2:30 pm. At our meetings we pray for those who have received shawls.

Approximately 90 Elevation and neighbourhood children took part, making for a fabulous week!

This year we changed things up in the fall with the mom's group and started meeting bi-weekly at Kristyn Young's house which worked so great that we have moved it back to the church for more space! Come on out and join us every other Monday morning.

Last year I shared that we were struggling to find a curriculum that would work for us and that my main aim was to resolve this. I am happy to say that we have found a great curriculum called "Orange". We use it for Grades 1-5 and it has been enjoyed by both teachers and kids.

As the Children's Ministry continues to grow, I am always looking for new ways to engage kids and parents in how we can partner together in this Journey of faith and appreciate all your support and help.

## **Junior & Senior Youth**

The Elevation Youth meet every Tuesday evening from 7:00-9:00, with an average of between 25-35 Youth each week. The schedule includes a split Jr. and Sr. High Bible Study every other week or so and a combined gym night, games night, or devotional on the other nights of the month. For our Bible studies, we have been focused on different big questions of faith, as well as a series on relationships where we explored relationship with God, Ourselves, Friends, and the World. Activities have ranged from movie nights to skating to giant sized angry birds! This year we have also incorporated using some of our Tuesday night times for service within the community, like serving a meal at Ray of Hope in Downtown Kitchener.

We have increased monthly extra events to twice a month, generally focusing on either a service night, or a special fun night. We have been Rock climbing, Christmas caroling, carving pumpkins with Seniors, and just hanging out over some board games and a movie! Another exciting new development has been the integration of Youth leading children's time. Starting February 14th, our Youth Band, and Youth Drama team lead the start of kids Quest as a chance to explore their gifts, as well as lead our kids in Biblical teaching and song! We had a blast at Jr. Pitch & Praise, and are looking forward to Sr. Youth Pitch & Praise in the spring!



This year we saw our first Sr. Youth Retreat- which was totally awesome! We had a blast exploring what it means to come away and encounter God through reflection and worship. We mixed in a lot of eating delicious food, big games, and campfires for a well-rounded weekend of growing closer to God and one another.

We have a solid team of Youth leaders that dedicate an insane amount of time and energy towards the Youth group. From hosting events, leading discussions, providing rides, last minute birthday baking, to extensive work on the Youth room, this is one dedicated team! It's been fun growing our relationships with the Youth and walking through these important years with them, and with one another!

Our vision continues to be to build the Youth group in a way where Youth can feel comfortable to be their own unique selves and can begin to find places for their talents and gifts to fit into the Elevation community as a whole! We look to tackle big questions, and learn more about what it means to live a life following the voice and example of Jesus Christ.

However, in addition there are three Mentoree Couples who have enriched their marriage through this ministry by the fellowship and friendship building they had with their Mentor Couple. That makes a total of 13 couples who have gleaned from more experienced married couples. This is very special and can only blossom relationships within and beyond Elevation Church. Judy and I are so very delighted to witness the willingness of each couple to share their lives and faith with each other.

This ministry does not require timetables, or specific meetings. Each M & M couple set their own timetables regarding the duration of their gathering, the frequency of their gathering, the length of time for each gathering, the locations for getting together. The locations could be anywhere from the beach, the park, the coffee shop or home. Each M & M couple decide on the topics they want to discuss, do not want to discuss, books they might want to use or not use and let each time they get together allow the conversation to guide their discussions. This may sound rather "loose" but all the feedback we receive proves that God guides the conversations. How does one get involved?
