





A government payment that ensures everyone has sufficient income when they need it - i.e., sufficient to meet basic needs.


It is delivered only to those who need it. It allows everyone to participate in society and live with dignity regardless of their work status.




More and more people are feeling the squeeze of financial precarity.

## PRECARIOUS JOBS

- In Canada, precarious employment increased by more than 50% over the past two decades (SSHRC, 2024)
- Underpaid, low-wage workers provide essential services
- 50% of Canadians under 55 years
   worry they will be impacted by job loss
   (Angus Reid, 2024)

# REDUCES HOUSING PRECARITY AND HOMELESSNESS

- Housing precarity homelessness study Vancouver
  - Prevent affordability evictions
- Remember homelessness impacts EVERYONE
  - Individuals, families, women fleeing violence, youth, seniors,
     veterans, and people with disabilities
  - All age groups, increasingly the younger working-age population
  - Rural, urban and remote communities across
     Ontario (Stroebel et al, 2021)


#### REDUCES FOOD INSECURITY

- In 2023–2024, the Food Bank of Waterloo Region and Cambridge Food Bank ... [experienced a] 31% increase compared to the year before." (Food Bank of Waterloo Region, 2024, p. 6)
- About 89% of food bank visits were due to cost of living (housing, food, utilities) (Feed Ontario, 2024)
- Those with jobs have become a growing demographic of food bank visitors (Feed Ontario, 2024)

**DRIVEN BY DESIGN** 

#### **Examples of cost estimates - Canada**

- PBO net annual cost based on Ontario pilot - \$40 to \$50 billion (2021)
- PEI demonstration project gross annual cost based on economic family
  \$53 billion (PBO, 2025)
- PB0 gross annual amount could be \$107 billion based on the nuclear family (2025)



### CRITERIA TO PAY FOR A BIG



**Has broad support from Canadians** 



Does not adversely impact how 97% of Canadians live



**Encourages entrepreneurship** 



**Improve tax fairness** 



Minimizes deficit financing




#### HOW?

Examples aligned with criteria

- Address tax havens
- Close tax loopholes
- Increases federal corporate taxes for large corporations
- Tackle web giants



4 STRATEGIES	POTENTIAL TOTAL ANNUAL REVENUE for CANADA	ESTIMATED DIRECT AND INDIRECT HEALTHCARE COSTS SAVINGS
1. Address tax havens	\$68 Billion (PBO, 2019)	PLUS
2. Close tax loopholes	\$1 Billion (Anderson, 2022)	Public Health Ontario estimated savings of \$21.5 billion annually, preventing primary risk factors for chronic disease.
3. Increase Corporate Taxes for Large Corporations	\$38 Billion (Alternative Federal Budget, 2024)	
4. Tackle Web Giants	\$3 Billion (Alternative Federal Budget, 2024 & Gauvin & MacEwen, 2021)	
Total	\$110 Billion	(PHO, 2019, p. 4)


